PUMPKIN GINGERBREAD

#### INGREDIENTS:

3 CUPS SUGAR
1 CUP VEGETABLE OIL
4 EGGS
2/3 CUP WATER
1 (15 OZ.) CAN OF PUMPKIN PUREE
2 TEASPOONS GROUND GINGER
1 TEASPOON GROUND CINNAMON
1 TEASPOON GROUND CLOVES
3 ½ CUPS ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR
2 TEASPOONS BAKING SODA
1 ½ TEASPOONS SALT
½ TEASPOON BAKING POWDER

# DIRECTIONS:

- . PREHEAT OVEN TO 350 DEGREES.
- . LIGHTLY GREASE TWO 9X5 INCH LOAF PANS.
- IN A LARGE MIXING BOWL, COMBINE SUGAR, OIL & AND EGGS; BEAT UNTIL SMOOTH. ADD WATER, AND BEAT
- UNTIL WELL BLENDED. STIR IN PUMPKIN, GINGER, ALLSPICE, CINNAMON, AND CLOVES.
- IN A MEDIUM BOWL, COMBINE FLOUR, SODA, SALT, AND BAKING POWDER.
- ADD DRY INGREDIENTS TO THE PUMPKIN MIXTURE AND BLEND JUST UNTIL ALL INGREDIENTS ARE MIXED
- . DIVIDE BATTER BETWEEN PREPARED PANS.
- Bake in preheated oven for about 50 minutes.

HERE ARE A FEW THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND:

**DON'T:** FEED DUCKS BREAD OR JUNK FOOD. FOODS LIKE BREAD AND CRACKERS HAVE NO NUTRITIONAL VALUE TO DUCKS AND CAN CAUSE MALNUTRITION AND PAINFUL DEFORMITIES IF CONSUMED TOO MUCH.



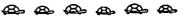
DO: FEED DUCKS CRACKED CORN,
OATS, RICE, BIRDSEED, FROZEN PEAS,
CHOPPED LETTUCE, OR SLICED
GRAPES. THESE FOODS ARE SIMILAR
TO NATURAL FOODS DUCKS WILL

FORAGE FOR ON THEIR OWN.

DON'T: LEAVE UNEATEN FOOD LYING AROUND. LEFTOVER FOOD IN THE WATER CAN ROT AND CAUSE DEADLY ALGAE BLOOMS THAT AFFECT LOCAL WILDLIFE.

**DON'T**: TRY TO PET WILD DUCKS. THEY MAY NOT APPRECIATE YOUR EFFORTS!

<u>DO</u>: KEEP A RESPECTFUL DISTANCE AND REMAIN NONTHREATENING, ESPECIALLY TO DUCKLINGS WHO MAY BECOME STRESSED OR INJURED MORE FASILY.





THE MAIN TYPE OF TURTLE LIVING IN OUR LAKE IS THE RED-EARED SLIDER. WE DO HAVE A FEW SOFT-SHELLED TURTLES AND A FEW SNAPPING TURTLES.

ALL AQUATIC TURTLES EAT AND SWALLOW WITH THEIR HEAD UNDER WATER AND WILL NOT EAT OUT OF THE WATER. IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO FEED THEM, THE FOLLOWING IS A LIST OF SMALL FOODS THAT ARE SAFE FOR THE TURTLES:

- AQUATIC PLANTS: WATER LILY, DUCKWEED, WATER FERN, AND WATER HYACINTH.
- FRUITS & VEGGIES: ROMAINE LETTUCE, COLLARD GREENS, DANDELION LEAVES, MOST BERRIES, APPLES, PEAR, GRAPES, BANANAS, PAPAYA, MOST MELONS, CARROTS, SQUASH, PEAS, AND MOST LEAFY GREENS.
- <u>Animal Prey</u>: Small apple and pond Snails, Earthworms, Silkworms, Mealworms, Roaches, Guppies, Hard-Boiled Eggs, and Crickets.
